NEW APPOINTMENTS & RESIGNATIONS

1. Blaise Metreweli – MI6's First Female Chief

- Blaise Metreweli has been appointed the first woman to lead the UK's foreign intelligence service, MI6, in its 116-year history
- She will be the 18th head (code-named "C"), officially taking office on 1 October 2025, succeeding Sir Richard Moore

2. India Reappoints Ambassador to North Korea After Four Years

- New Ambassador: Aliawati Longkumer, a 2008-batch Indian Foreign Service (IFS) officer, has been appointed as India's Ambassador to North Korea. She is currently serving as the Charge d'affaires at the Indian Embassy in Asuncion, Paraguay.
- Embassy Status: India reopened its embassy in Pyongyang in December 2024, after closing it in July 2021 due to COVID-19 pandemic-related restrictions
- Previous Ambassador: The last Indian ambassador to North Korea was Atul Malhari Gotsurve, who served until the embassy's closure in 2021

3. Amitabh Kant Resigns as G20 Sherpa What is Sherpa?

- The term "Sherpa" originates from the **Sherpa people** in Nepal, who are known for guiding climbers through challenging mountain terrains, like Mount Everest. In a metaphorical sense, the Sherpa guides and prepares the path for the leaders during international negotiations.
- A **Sherpa** is a term used in diplomacy and international relations to refer to a senior official who is responsible for preparing the agenda and discussions for major international summits or meetings, especially the G20 or G7 summits.
- The Sherpa's primary role is to lead the preparatory work and negotiations for the head of state or government (e.g., the Prime Minister or President) ahead of the summit.

4. First Woman (Aide-de-Camp) ADC to President of India

• Lieutenant Commander Yashasvi Solankee has been appointed as the first woman officer from the Indian Navy to serve as an Aide-de-Camp (ADC) to the President of India, Droupadi Murmu.

What is Aide-de-Camp (ADC)?

- An Aide-de-Camp (ADC) is a personal assistant or military officer who serves as an aide to a senior leader, typically a head of state, government official, or military commander.
- The role of the ADC is to provide administrative and logistical support, assist with various official duties, and represent the leader in certain functions. The term "Aide-de-Camp" is of French origin and literally means "assistant to the field."

What Is a 'Bunny Hop' Catch?

• **Definition**: A boundary catch where a fielder makes multiple airborne contacts with the ball while outside the boundary

Rule Change Details

- **Previous Law (19.5.2)**: Allowed fielders to make multiple airborne contacts with the ball outside the boundary if their first contact with the ground was inside the boundary.
- Updated Law:
- o 19.5.2.1: A fielder may only touch the ball once while airborne after jumping from outside the boundary.
- o 19.5.2.2: After any airborne contact from outside the boundary, the fielder must land inside the field of play to complete the catch.
- Relay Catches: If the first fielder jumps from outside the boundary and parries the ball, they must land inside the field before any subsequent contact.

5. Russell Wins in Canadian GP as McLaren Collide

- George Russell secured his first victory of the 2025 Formula 1 season at the Canadian Grand Prix, driving for Mercedes.

1. SIPRI Report: India Increases Its Nuclear Arsenal

According to the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) Yearbook 2025, India's nuclear arsenal has slightly expanded, with an estimated 180 warheads as of January 2025, surpassing Pakistan's estimated 170 warheads. However, China's arsenal remains significantly larger, with approximately 600 warheads, including 24 deployed on missiles or stationed at military bases.

Key Developments in India's Nuclear Arsenal

- **Expansion of Arsenal**: India's nuclear stockpile increased from 172 warheads in 2024 to 180 in 2025, marking a steady growth in its strategic capabilities
- **Modernization Efforts**: India continues to develop advanced nuclear delivery systems, including canisterized missiles that can be transported with mated warheads, enhancing readiness and potentially enabling multiple warhead capabilities.
- Nuclear Triad: India maintains a credible nuclear triad comprising land-based missiles, aircraft, and nuclear-powered ballistic missile submarines (SSBNs), ensuring a robust second-strike capability.

2. Supervisory Data Quality Index (sDQI) Key Highlights

- The Supervisory Data Quality Index (sDQI) is a metric developed by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). It evaluates the quality of data submitted by Scheduled Commercial Banks (SCBs) based on four key parameters: accuracy, timeliness, completeness, and consistency
- **sDQI Overview**: The sDQI assesses data quality across key financial parameters, including asset quality, capital adequacy, and liquidity, focusing on accuracy, timeliness, completeness, and consistency.

- **Coverage**: The index evaluates 87 SCBs and their returns, encompassing metrics like asset-liability and off-balance sheet exposures, operating results, risk-based supervision returns, and liquidity returns
- Performance by Bank Category:
 Public Sector Banks: Scored 88.8
 Private Sector Banks: Scored 89.6

o Foreign Banks: Scored 89.1

DEFENCE & SECURITY

1. Operation Rising Lion

- Operation Rising Lion, launched by Israel in June 2025, targeted Iran's key nuclear facilities, including Natanz, Isfahan, and Arak, aiming to dismantle its nuclear infrastructure.
- The operation, involving over 200 fighter jets, has escalated tensions, with Iran vowing retaliation.
- The strikes have intensified geopolitical instability, raising concerns about further regional conflict.

2. Operation True Promise III

- Initiated by: Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC)
- **Date**: June 13, 2025
- Context: A direct response to Israel's Operation Rising Lion, which targeted Iranian nuclear and military facilities, resulting in the deaths of several high-ranking IRGC officials and scientists.

Key Targets and Impact

- Israeli Military Installations: Missiles struck the Kirya (IDF headquarters) in Tel Aviv, the Weizmann Institute of Science in Rehovot, and the Israeli Military Intelligence School at Camp Moshe Dayan, causing significant damage.
- Civilian Areas: Bat Yam, Tamra, Ramat Gan, and Rishon LeZion were hit, resulting in numerous casualties, including fatalities among foreign nationals.
- Infrastructure: The Bazan Oil Refinery Complex and Haifa Power Plant were damaged, leading to fires and operational shutdowns.

3. Rudrastra VTOL (Vertical Take-Off and Landing)

• The Indian Army has successfully tested the indigenous Rudrastra VTOL (Vertical Take-Off and Landing) drone, **developed by Solar Aerospace and Defence Limited (SDAL)**, at the Pokhran Firing Range in June 2025.

Key Features of Rudrastra

- **Design**: Hybrid VTOL UAV combining vertical lift-off like a helicopter with long-range flight capabilities akin to a jet.
- **Payload**: Equipped with an 8 kg precision-guided anti-personnel/light-armour warhead that airbursts at low altitude.

- **Surveillance**: Features a dual-channel Electro-Optical/Infrared (EO/IR) gimbal and laser designator for real-time video feed.
- **Autonomy**: Capable of autonomous return-home logic, enabling silent Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) loitering or "find-fix-finish" strike missions.

4. Exercise Tiger Claw 2025

- India and the United States have successfully concluded "Exercise Tiger Claw 2025," marking their first independent Special Forces drill.
- Held from May 26 to June 10, 2025, at the **Garud Regimental Training Centre in Chandinagar**, **Uttar Pradesh**, the exercise aimed to enhance interoperability and strengthen defense cooperation between the Indian Air Force (IAF) and the United States Air Force (USAF)

5. Exercise Cyber Suraksha 2025:

Overview

- Initiated by: Defence Cyber Agency (DCA) under the Headquarters Integrated Defence Staff (IDS)
- **Duration**: June 16 June 27, 2025
- **Participants**: Over 100 personnel from national security agencies, defence forces, and cybersecurity stakeholders
- **Objective**: Enhance national cyber resilience by simulating real-world cyber threats and testing response capabilities.

6. Iran's Fattah-1 Missile

- **Developed by Iran**, the Fattah is **an intermediate-range ballistic missile** capable of reaching **hypersonic speeds** up to 15 times the speed of sound, enabling it to bypass missile defense systems.
- With a range of 1,400 kilometers and solid propellants, it offers enhanced maneuverability.
- The missile is also designed to carry various warheads for diverse operational purposes.

7. Exercise Shakti 2025:

- Exercise Shakti 2025, the 8th edition, will take place from June 18 to July 1, 2025, at Camp Larzac, La Cavalerie, France
- The exercise will involve 90 personnel from the Indian Army, primarily from a battalion of the Jammu and Kashmir Rifles, along with members from other arms and services, and 90 personnel from the French Army's 13th Foreign Legion Half-Brigade (13th DBLE).
- The objective is to enhance joint military capabilities for multi-domain operations in subconventional scenarios under Chapter VII of the United Nations Charter.

8. INS Arnala

• On June 18, 2025, the Indian Navy inducted INS Arnala, its first Anti-Submarine Warfare Shallow Water Craft (ASW-SWC), at the Naval Dockyard in Visakhapatnam.

- The 77-meter-long vessel, designed for shallow-water operations, is equipped with advanced sonar, mine-laying capabilities, and a 30mm Naval Surface Gun system.
- INS Arnala is the first of 16 indigenously built ASW-SWC vessels, aligning with India's "Aatmanirbhar Bharat" initiative to enhance coastal defense.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS

- 1. "India Suspends Rare Earth Exports to Japan to Strengthen Domestic Supply Chain"
- India has directed state-run miner IREL (Indian Rare Earths Limited) to suspend its 13-year-old rare earth export agreement with Japan's Toyotsu Rare Earths India.
- This decision aims to prioritize domestic supply and reduce dependence on China amid global supply chain disruptions.
 - **About IREL (Indian Rare Earths Limited)**
- Indian Rare Earths Limited (IREL) is a Government of India enterprise under the Department of Atomic Energy (DAE), established on August 18, 1950.
- Headquartered in Mumbai, Maharashtra, IREL specializes in the mining, processing, and refining of rare earth elements and other strategic minerals essential for India's energy, defense, and electronics sectors
- 2. COVID-19 subvariant "Nimbus" (NB.1.8.1)
- The new COVID-19 subvariant "Nimbus" (NB.1.8.1), a descendant of Omicron, has been classified as a "Variant Under Monitoring" by WHO due to its increased transmissibility.
- Detected in over 20 countries, including the US, UK, and India, it accounts for up to 10–37% of recent global cases.
- Though symptoms like a severe "razor-blade" sore throat are notable, the variant poses low risk with no significant rise in hospitalizations.
- 3. Nano-cups for photothermal therapy (PTT)
- Indian scientists from INST Mohali, IIT Bombay, and ACTREC-Tata Memorial Centre have developed gold nano-cups for advanced photothermal cancer therapy.
- These nano-cups are synthesized using a **green**, **one-step method** with Vitamin C and ZIF-8 MOF, avoiding toxic chemicals and high temperatures.
- They convert near-infrared light into localized heat to **non-invasively destroy cancer cells**, with successful results in preclinical breast cancer models.
- This innovation enhances **biocompatibility**, **reduces relapse**, and opens new possibilities in hybrid therapies, diagnostics, and biosensing.

GOVERNMENT SCHEMES & INITIATIVES

- 1. Digital India Programme
- **Digital India Programme**, launched on **1st July 2015**, aims to transform India into a digitally empowered society and knowledge economy.

- It focuses on three key areas: digital infrastructure, governance & services on demand, and digital empowerment of citizens.
- Major initiatives include **Aadhaar**, **BharatNet**, **DigiLocker**, **UMANG**, and **DBT**, with over ₹44 lakh crore transferred across 322 schemes.
- While it has boosted digital inclusion, challenges like the digital divide, cybersecurity, and digital literacy still persist.

2. ESIC Sanath Nagar Campus Emerges as Model of Excellence in Public Healthcare and Medical Education

• The ESIC Medical College and Hospital in Sanath Nagar, Hyderabad, has emerged as a leading institution in public healthcare and medical education. Established with the goal of providing affordable and accessible services, it now stands as a national benchmark with state-of-the-art facilities.

Objective:

To provide social security and health insurance to workers and their families in the organized sector, ensuring protection against medical, maternity, disability, and employment-related contingencies.

3. Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY)

- It was launched on 10th September 2020, PMMSY aims to boost fish production, promote sustainable aquaculture, and double fishers' income by 2024-25 under the Blue Revolution 2.0.
- It involves a **record investment of ₹20,050 crore**, making it the largest-ever initiative in India's fisheries sector.
- Targets by 2024-25 include 22 million metric tonnes of fish production, ₹1 lakh crore in exports, and ~55 lakh jobs.
- It includes Centrally Sponsored and Central Sector Schemes, focusing on inland/marine fisheries, cold chains, insurance, and digital governance.
- In 2025, the Union Minister emphasized collaborative implementation and use of tech like drones, biofloc, and RAS, as India becomes the 2nd largest global fish producer.

4. India's First Agri-Drone Hub Inaugurated in Chennai

- Union Minister Kamlesh Paswan inaugurated India's first Agri-Drone Indigenization Facility in Chennai on 14 June 2025, built by Garuda Aerospace across a 35,000 sq ft campus
- The hub enables end-to-end development—design, manufacturing, and testing—of unmanned aerial systems (UAS) for agriculture, aligning with the **Atmanirbhar Bharat** vision by producing seven subsystems and 33 parts locally

- Alongside the facility, 300 Centres of Excellence were launched nationwide, and a DGCA-approved Train-the-Trainer programme was flagged off to build a skilled rural drone workforce
- The event highlighted government-backed initiatives such as **drone-didi training**, PLI and subsidy schemes, with Garuda Aerospace already producing **4,000 drones**, aiming for **100,000 Made-in-India drones by 2026**

5. 50 years of the Crocodile Conservation Project on World Crocodile Day

- On 17 June 2025 (World Crocodile Day), India marked 50 years of the Crocodile Conservation Project, which began in 1975 with UNDP and FAO support Crocodile Conservation Project (CCP) – Key Highlights
- Launched in 1975 at Bhitarkanika, Odisha, supported by UNDP & FAO, with the "rear and release" method to rebuild wild populations of gharials, muggers, and saltwater crocodiles
- Odisha is the only state with all three native crocodilian species; saltwater crocs in Bhitarkanika rose from ~95 (1975) to ~1,800+ by 2025, alongside gharial and mugger recoveries.
- **Expanded nationwide**: breeding centres and sanctuaries established in states like Uttar Pradesh (Kukrail, Satkosia, etc.), Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, enabling widespread captive breeding and reintroduction.
- **Population rebound**: approx. 3,000 wild gharials, ~2,500 saltwater crocodiles, and ~300 muggers in key habitats as of 2025; CCP seen as a global conservation model.
- **Emerging challenges**: human–crocodile conflicts and climate change threats, prompting safety measures (barricades, warnings), habitat monitoring, and a shift toward research-based coexistence

6. DhartiAaba Janbhagidari Abhiyan

- The Ministry of Tribal Affairs launched the largest-ever tribal empowerment campaign DhartiAaba Janbhagidari Abhiyan, a massive benefit-saturation drive across 549 tribal districts and 207 PVTG-dominated districts, covering over 100,000 villages from 15–30 June 2025
- Aimed at delivering **doorstep access to entitlements**, the campaign includes Aadhaar enrolment, Ayushman Bharat cards, Jan Dhan accounts, PM-Kisan registrations, pensions, scholarships, insurance, skill training, and livelihood programs
- Designed under the Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh initiative and aligned with PM-JANMAN, it promotes last-mile delivery, community participation, and dignified tribal empowerment
- Coordinated by over **125 district administrations**, the participatory model ensures officials and tribal community leaders mobilize eligible households and provide on-spot registrations
- The campaign has been described as **unprecedented in scale and planning**, signalling a new benchmark in **inclusive**, **convergence-based governance** for tribal upliftment

- 7. FASTag ₹3,000 annual pass for private vehicles
- Union Minister Nitin Gadkari announced the introduction of a FASTag-based annual pass for private cars, jeeps, and vans—priced at ₹3,000, valid from August 15, 2025, for either one year or 200 toll trips, whichever comes first
- The pass is applicable only on National Highway and Expressway toll plazas managed by NHAI and is non-transferable, tied to a single vehicle's FASTag
- Frequent highway commuters can save up to ₹7,000 annually, bringing the average toll cost down to ₹15 per trip, while also reducing congestion and wait times at toll booths.
- Activation and renewal will be available via the **Rajmarg Yatra app**, as well as the official **NHAI/MoRTH websites**, with no need for a new FASTag if the existing tag meets the criteria

What is FASTag?

- FASTag is an RFID-based electronic toll collection system introduced by the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) to enable automatic and cashless toll payments on national highways.
- Affixed to a vehicle's windshield and linked to a prepaid account or digital wallet, it allows seamless passage through toll plazas without stopping.
- Made mandatory for all four-wheelers since February 15, 2021, FASTag helps reduce congestion, save time and fuel, and promote transparent, digital transactions in line with the Digital India initiative.

(MISCELLANEOUS) ONE LINER CURRENT AFFAIRS:

- 1. India has launched its first **cherry cargo train**, a refrigerated parcel rake operating between **Katra (Jammu & Kashmir) and Mumbai**, carrying **24 tonnes of cherries** in just over **30 hours**—a journey that previously took 6–7 days by road.
- 2. On 1 June 2025 in Pune, the Investor Education and Protection Fund Authority (IEPFA) under the MCA, in partnership with SEBI, launched the first-ever "Niveshak Shivir"—a one-stop investor empowerment camp aimed at resolving unclaimed dividends and shares, facilitating KYC and nomination updates, and assisting with IEPF claim forms via 19 dedicated kiosks for over 450 participants
- 3. The Jagannath Rath Yatra 2025 began with Snana Purnima on June 11, where the deities were bathed with 108 pots of sacred water. This marks the start of their 15-day seclusion (Anavasara), before reappearing for the grand chariot procession on June 27.
- 4. Archaeologists have unearthed the foundation of an 800-year-old Pandya-era Shiva temple in Udampatti village, Madurai district, Tamil Nadu. Inscriptions link it to Maravarman Sundara Pandya I (circa 1217–1218 CE), mentioning the village's old name "Attur" and recording details like a "half a kalam levy".

- 5. Sri Lanka celebrated **Poson Poya** on **10–11 June 2025**, marking over **2,000 years since Buddhism's introduction** by Arahat Mahinda at Mihintale—a pivotal moment in the nation's spiritual history. The full-moon observance included pilgrimages to Mihintale and Anuradhapura, temple rituals, meditation, almsgiving, and community activities like free food stalls ("dansals") and lantern decorations.
- 6. On June 5, 2025, Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin declared **Dhanushkodi lagoon** as the **Greater Flamingo Sanctuary**, covering **524.7 hectares** within the Gulf of Mannar Biosphere Reserve. Located at the southern tip of Rameswaram Island, it lies on the **Central Asian Flyway**, hosting over **10,700 migratory wetland birds** from 128 species, including flamingos, herons, and sandpipers.
- 7. India's first E-Waste Recycling Eco-Park is set to be established in Holambi Kalan, Delhi, across 11.4 acres under a public-private partnership using the DBFOT model
- 8. Bangladesh's interim government, led by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus, has amended the National Freedom Fighters Council Act (JAMUKA) to remove the title "Father of the Nation" for Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and the words referencing him from the law's text
- 9. Bangladesh's central bank, under the interim government led by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus, unveiled a new series of banknotes on June 1, 2025, which notably omit the portrait of Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the nation's founding father. The redesigned ₹20, ₹50, and ₹1,000 notes now feature natural landscapes, temples, mosques, historic palaces, and artwork, replacing human imagery entirely
- 10. DFCC Bank of Sri Lanka became the **first foreign entity** to list green bonds on **NSE IX** at **GIFT City**, marking a major milestone in cross-border sustainable finance.
- 11. Maruti Suzuki inaugurated India's largest in-plant railway siding at its Manesar facility—a fully electrified, 8.2 km multimodal cargo terminal capable of dispatching 450,000 vehicles annually—significantly advancing green logistics with projected savings of 60 million liters of fuel and 175,000 tonnes of CO₂ emissions per year.
- 12. The UN General Assembly, in a resolution adopted on May 2, 2024 (A/RES/78/279), officially declared 2026 as the International Year of the Woman Farmer to honour women's pivotal role in global food production and sustainable agriculture.
