NEW APPOINTMENTS & RESIGNATIONS

- 1. Ashwani Lohani Appointed as Director of Prime Ministers Museum and Library
- Appointing Body: Appointments Committee of the Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi
- **Date of Order**: 4 June 2025.
- **Tenure**: Three years from assumption of charge.
- **About** Appointments Committee of the Cabinet:
- The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) is a high-level decision-making body of the Government of India responsible for appointments to several top posts in the bureaucracy and public sector undertakings. It is not a constitutional body but functions under the Government of India (Transaction of Business) Rules, 1961.
- The ACC is **headed by the Prime Minister** of India. The **Union Home Minister** is the only other permanent member of the committee. The committee may also consult other ministers or departments on specific matters, but the final decision lies with the core ACC members.
- The ACC approves appointments to key posts such as Cabinet Secretary, Chiefs of the Armed Forces, Heads of Public Sector Enterprises, Secretaries to the Government of India, and top-level officials of statutory and autonomous bodies like the CBI, RBI, UPSC, and more.
- 2. Five countries elected to serve on UN Security Council
- Bahrain, Colombia, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Latvia, and Liberia were elected on Tuesday to serve as non-permanent members of the UN Security Council, with two-year terms beginning in January 2026.

Election of Non-Permanent Members

The UN Security Council has 15 members:

- 5 permanent members (P5): China, France, Russia, the United Kingdom, and the United States (with veto power).
- 10 non-permanent members: Elected for 2-year terms on a regional rotation basis.
- Election Authority:

The UN General Assembly (UNGA) elects the non-permanent members.

Voting Process:

- Elections are held **annually**, usually in **June**, to elect **5 new members** (as the term of 5 outgoing members ends on 31 December).
- Each UN member state casts a **secret ballot**.
- To be elected, a country must receive a **two-thirds majority** of the votes **cast and present** in the General Assembly.
- If no candidate receives two-thirds majority in the first round, **subsequent rounds** are held until the required threshold is met.
- A country **cannot be immediately re-elected** after completing a two-year term.
- The 10 non-permanent UNSC seats are regionally allocated as: Africa 3, Asia-Pacific 2, Latin America & Caribbean 2, Western Europe & Others 2, and Eastern Europe 1.

About Financial Services Institutions Bureau

- The Financial Services Institutions Bureau is an autonomous government body constituted by the Centre on 1 July 2022 (replacing the Banks Board Bureau) under the Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance
- Its primary mandate is to recommend candidates for senior leadership roles—namely Whole-Time Directors (WTDs) and Non-Executive Chairpersons (NECs)—on the boards of Public Sector Banks (PSBs), Public Sector Financial Institutions (FIs) like NABARD, SIDBI, IFCI, Exim Bank, and Public Sector Insurance companies (PSIs)
- 5. S Mahendra Dev Appointed as Chairman of PM's Economic Advisory Council What is the EAC-PM?
- The Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, also known as PMEAC or EAC-PM, is a non-constitutional, non-permanent, and independent body set up to advise the Prime Minister on economic and related matters
- Its **Terms of Reference** include analyzing any economic issue (suo moto or referred), submitting periodic and monthly reports, addressing macroeconomic challenges, and undertaking tasks as directed by the PM
- While its guidance is **not binding**, it plays a key role in shaping public discourse and policy formulation through well-respected reports like the **Economic Outlook** and **Review of Economy**
- 6. India Secures IIAS Presidency (2025–2028)
- On June 3, 2025, India was elected to the presidency of the International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS) for the 2025–2028 term, winning 87 out of 141 votes (61.7%) and defeating Austria in the final round.
- Shri V. Srinivas, Secretary (DARPG, Govt. of India), was elected as **President of IIAS** for the 2025–2028 term

About International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS)

- International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS), founded in 1930, is a global non-profit headquartered in Brussels, dedicated to research, education, and best practices in public administration
- Operates as a federation comprising 31 member states, 20 national sections, and 15 academic research centers, and collaborates with the UN's CEPA and UNPAN

8. MS Dhoni Enters ICC Hall of Fame

- Along with Dhoni ,alongside players like Matthew Hayden, Graeme Smith, Hashim Amla, Daniel Vettori, Sarah Taylor, and Sana Mir were also inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame
- MS Dhoni became the 11th Indian player to be inducted into the ICC Hall of Fame. Other India players inducted into the list are Sunil Gavaskar (2009), Bishan Singh Bedi (2009), Kapil Dev (2010), Anil Kumble (2015), Rahul Dravid (2018), Sachin Tendulkar (2019), Virender Sehwag (2023), Neetu David (2023), Diana Edulji (2024) and Vinoo Mankad (2021)

9. **PSA Awards 2024-25**

- The PSA Awards are annual honors presented by the Professional Squash Association (PSA) to recognize the top-performing athletes and emerging talents in global professional squash.

About Commission for Air Quality Management (CAQM)

- A statutory body formed under the Commission for Air Quality Management in NCR and Adjoining Areas Act, 2021, effective August 2021
- Replaced the earlier Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority (EPCA), granted **penal powers**, unlike its advisory predecessor

Mandate & Jurisdiction

- Oversee air quality coordination, research, regulation, and enforcement across the **Delhi-NCR region**, including adjoining areas of Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Rajasthan
- All directions are binding, capable of overriding state-level pollution control bodies and CPCB in cases of conflict

1. EnviStats India 2025

• Released on June 5, 2025, by the Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation (MoSPI) during a national workshop in New Delhi focused on frontier technologies in policy-making

Key Environmental Trends (2013–14 to 2023–24)

Power Production:

- o Thermal power generation rose from 792,053 GWh to 1,326,549 GWh.
- Renewable electricity jumped from **65,520 GWh to 225,835 GWh**, underscoring growth in green energy.

Fisheries Output:

- o Inland fish production more than doubled—from **6.14 to 13.91 million tonnes**.
- o Marine fish output increased from 3.44 to 4.50 million tonnes.

Climate & Biodiversity Metrics

- Temperature Rise (2001–2024):
 - o Average annual temperature increased from 25.05 °C to 25.74 °C.
 - o Minimum and maximum temperatures also showed upwards trends <u>pib.gov.in</u>.

Rainfall Patterns:

 Notable annual fluctuations, but no clear long-term increase or decrease in total rainfall.

• Species Diversity:

- o Of 2.48 million marine species worldwide, India hosts 20,613.
- Freshwater species tally at 9,436, mangrove species at 5,023, estuarine at 3,383, and a remarkable 22,404 in soil ecosystems.
- o In total, India supports 104,561 of the global 1.67 million faunal species

2. World Population Prospects 2024 report

- This report has been releases by United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA)
 Findings of the report:
- As per the **UNFPA's State of World Population 2025 report**, India's population has surpassed **1.46 billion**, making it the most populous country, overtaking China.
- The **Total Fertility Rate (TFR)** has dropped to **1.9 births per woman**, which is **below the replacement level** of 2.1 needed to maintain population levels without immigration.
- In urban areas, the TFR is even lower—between 1.6 and 1.7, especially among the educated middle-class in regions like Delhi, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu
- The **southern states** are witnessing the sharpest fertility declines, while some **northern states** still hover near the replacement rate.
- India's population is projected to **peak around 1.7 billion by 2065** and then begin declining. If the fertility rate continues below the replacement level, it could drop to 930–940 million by the year 2100.
- 3. Extreme poverty in India down to 5.3% in 2022-23: World Bank Findings of the report:

- According to the World Bank, India's extreme poverty rate dropped dramatically from 27.1% in 2011–12 to just 5.3% in 2022–23
- In absolute terms, the number of people living in extreme poverty fell from approximately **344.5 million to about 75.2 million** over the same period
- This translates into nearly **270 million individuals** being lifted out of extreme poverty
- The World Bank raised the global poverty threshold to US \$3 per day (2021 PPP) from \$2.15, prompting a stricter benchmark
- 4. Holématthi Nature Foundation (HNF) Survey

Bengaluru Now India's Leopard Capital defeating Mumbai

- A recent year-long camera-trap survey by Holématthi Nature Foundation (HNF), led by Dr. Sanjay Gubbi, has found **80–85 free-ranging leopards** in the forests surrounding Bengaluru, surpassing Mumbai's count of approximately **54**
- This makes Bengaluru the metropolis with the highest known urban leopard population in India
- 5. 'Global Data Center Market Comparison 2025' by Cushman & Wakefield report
- A Cushman & Wakefield report covering 97 global cities places Mumbai in 6th position for data centre capacity under construction, surpassing global tech hubs like London and Dublin

Globally, the top five cities by under-construction capacity are:

- Virginia (1,834 MW)
- Atlanta (1,078 MW)
- Columbus (546 MW)
- Dallas (500 MW)
- Phoenix (478 MW)

In the same report, **Pune** and **Bengaluru** emerged as the **4th** and **5th** fastest-growing APAC data centre hubs, respectively

Within the Asia-Pacific, Mumbai ranks as the 7th most established data centre market

DEFENCE & SECURITY

- 1. India's First Underwater Museum and Artificial Coral Reef to Be Developed Around INS Guldar in Maharashtraered By
- India's first underwater museum and artificial coral reef will be developed around the decommissioned warship INS Guldar near **Nivati Rocks at Vengurla in Sindhudurg district of Maharashtra.**
- The initiative, supported by the central government, aims to boost marine conservation and tourism, offering scuba diving and future submarine tours. The Union Tourism Ministry has approved 46.91 crore rupees for the project.
 About INS Guldar
- INS Guldar (L21) was a Kumbhir-class tank landing ship built in Poland and commissioned into the Indian Navy on 30 December 1985 by Gdańsk/Gdynia Shipyard.

- Served initially with the Eastern Naval Command (1985–1995), later transferring to the Andaman & Nicobar Command until decommissioning
- Officially **decommissioned on 12 January 2024**, alongside INS Cheetah and INS Kumbhir, closing nearly **40 years of distinguished service**

2. Exercise Khaan Ouest 2025

- The Indian Army is participated in the 22nd edition of Exercise Khaan Quest, which is being held from 14th to 28th June 2025 at the Five Hills Training Area near Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.
- Mongolia and the United States initially launched Khaan Quest as a bilateral exercise in 2003. By 2006, it had expanded into a multinational peacekeeping drill involving several nations under the United Nations mandate.
- A 40-member Indian contingent, primarily from the Kumaon Regiment, has joined the exercise. The team includes one woman officer and two women soldiers, reflecting India's commitment to gender inclusion in international peacekeeping.

SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS

1. Elon Musk's Starlink To Make Debut In India

The Indian Department of Telecommunications (DoT) has issued the Global Mobile Personal Communication by Satellite license to SpaceX-owned Starlink, making it the third satellite-internet provider in India—alongside Airtel-OneWeb and Reliance Jio Satellite Communications.

What is Starlink?

- Starlink is a satellite internet constellation project developed and operated by SpaceX, the private aerospace company founded by Elon Musk. Its primary aim is to provide high-speed, low-latency broadband internet across the globe, especially in rural and remote areas where traditional internet infrastructure is limited or unavailable.
- It aims to deliver internet access worldwide through a constellation of low-Earth orbit (LEO) satellites.
- Starlink is already operational in North America, Europe, Australia, parts of South America, Japan, and now entering India, Southeast Asia, and Africa.

2. Axiom 4 Space Mission:

- A private astronaut mission, **Axiom Mission 4** (**Ax-4**), organized by **Axiom Space** in partnership with **NASA** and **SpaceX**, will send four astronauts—including the first Indian astronaut to the ISS since 1984—to the International Space Station for up to 14 days
- The mission will launch aboard the SpaceX Falcon 9 Block 5 rocket using the Crew Dragon C213 spacecraft, which is the fifth and final capsule in the Dragon series.

- 3. Russia to build eight nuclear plants in Iran: Atomic chief
- Iranian Atomic Energy Organization chief Mohammad Eslami confirmed that **Russia** will construct eight nuclear reactors in Iran under a pre-existing agreement
- Bushehr Focus: Four of the new reactors will be built in Bushehr Province, complementing the ongoing construction of Units 2 & 3 at the operational Bushehr plant
- Implementing Agency: Russia's Rosatom, in cooperation with Iran's Atomic Energy Organisation (AEOI)

GOVERNMENT SCHEMES & INITIATIVES

- 1. "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0"
- Name & Tagline: "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0" plant a sapling in honor of one's mother, symbolizing environmental care and cultural values
- Launch Date: Phase 2 kicked off on World Environment Day (June 5, 2025) by PM Modi and officially supported by Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on June 5 and Delhi CM Rekha Gupta on June 9
- The campaign aims to plant 10 crore saplings across India by September 30, 2025, including 70 lakh saplings in Delhi's urban areas during 2025–26.

2. Bharatiya Bhasha Anubhag

On 5 June 2025 in New Delhi, **Union Home Minister Amit Shah** launched the Bharatiya Bhasha Anubhag, a dedicated section under the Department of Official Language. **Key Highlights:**

- This initiative elevates the **Department of Official Language** to a fully-fledged department focused on Indian languages.
- It marks a **milestone** in reducing administrative dependence on foreign languages.
- The platform offers **structured support** for India's multilingual diversity and linguistic heritage
- 3. PM Modi inaugurating the world's highest railway arch bridge over the Chenab River:
- On 6 June 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the iconic Chenab Railway Bridge, completing the final segment of the Udhampur-Srinagar-Baramulla Rail Link—officially connecting the Kashmir Valley to India's railway grid after nearly 28 years of phased construction
- The Chenab Railway Bridge, at 1.315 km long and 359 m high, stands taller than the Eiffel Tower, making it the world's highest railway arch bridge.
- The bridge enables all-weather rail connectivity to Kashmir, reducing Katra–Srinagar travel time to around 3 hours via the Vande Bharat Express.

4. Khichan and Menar wetlands receiving Ramsar designation

Khichan (Phalodi) and Menar (Udaipur) in Rajasthan were officially designated as **Ramsar Sites** on 4 June 2025, just before World Environment Day. This brings India's total to **91 Ramsar wetlands**, the highest in Asia and third globally

What is the Ramsar Convention

- An international treaty signed in **1971 in Ramsar, Iran**, for the conservation and sustainable use of wetlands.
- India became a signatory in 1982.
- Ramsar Sites are **wetlands of international importance**, recognized for their ecological, botanical, zoological, limnological, or hydrological significance.

5. Population Census 2027

- The Government of India has announced that the 16th decennial Population Census, scheduled for March 1, 2027 (reference date), will be held in two phases and will include caste enumeration for the first time since 1931
- The 2027 Census will include data on castes and sub-castes, including OBCs, making it the first detailed caste census since 1931.

What is the Census of India?

- The Census of India is a decennial (once every 10 years) national exercise to collect comprehensive data on population, housing, demography, socio-economic conditions, and more.
- It is conducted by the Office of the Registrar General and Census Commissioner, under the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- It is the largest administrative and statistical exercise in the world.
 What is a Caste Census?
- A caste census refers to the collection of data on castes, sub-castes, and social categories during a national population survey.
- The last full caste enumeration was conducted in 1931, while post-independence censuses from 1951 to 2011 excluded caste data for OB except for SCs and STs.
- The 2027 Caste Census will be conducted in two phases starting March 1, 2027 (Oct 1 for hilly regions), using digital devices in 16 languages to enumerate OBCs, sub-castes, and SC/ST data.

6. Swachhata Pakhwada 2025:

The **Department of Biotechnology (DBT)** under the Ministry of Science & Technology conducted **Swachhata Pakhwada** from 1–15 May 2025, organizing 188 cleanliness and awareness activities across its HQ, institutions, and PSUs nationwide

What Is Swachhata Pakhwada?

- A fortnight-long cleanliness campaign initiated in April 2016, observed across government ministries, departments, PSUs, and educational institutions to reinforce sanitation and hygiene principles
- Swachhata Pakhwada 2025 featured infrastructure upgrades like e-waste bins and sanitary units, health drives including CPR training and plastic awareness, and public engagement through clean-up drives, tree planting, and community activities.

7. Ladakh Reservation & Language Regulations 2025

On **June 3, 2025**, President Murmu used Article 240 powers to issue three major regulations adjusting reservation, domicile, language, and governance in Ladakh

Key Regulations

Reservation Amendment 2025

- Caps reservation for SC/ST/OBC and socially backward groups to 85%, excluding 10% EWS.
- Applies to both government jobs and professional college seats, boosting total reservation to 95%.

Domicile Certificate Rules 2025

- Defines domicile criteria: 15+ years residence, 7 years schooling in Ladakh, or children of Central Govt employees serving 10+ years.
- Tehsildars issue domicile certificates; Deputy Commissioners handle appeals
 Official Languages Regulation 2025
- Recognizes English, Hindi, Urdu, Bhoti, and Purgi as official languages.
- Promotes Shina, Brokskat, Balti, and Ladakhi to preserve cultural-linguistic diversity
 LAHDC Amendment Regulation 2025
- Reserves **one-third of seats** in Leh and Kargil hill councils for women, with rotational reservations

8. UMEED Portal for Waqf Management

- The UMEED portal was launched on June 6, 2025, by Union Minority Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju along with Minister of State George Kurian.
 - What is the UMEED Portal?
- UMEED stands for Unified Waqf Management, Empowerment, Efficiency, and Development.
- It is a **centralised digital platform** to register, monitor, geo-tag, and manage all Waqf properties in real time

Key Features

- Geo-tagged digital inventory of waqf properties with unique IDs
- Online grievance redressal mechanism
- Transparent leasing and usage tracking integrated with GIS/e-governance tools
- **Public access** to verified records and reports for accountability

9. Ayush Nivesh Saarthi

- The Ayush Nivesh Saarthi portal was launched on May 29, 2025, during the Ayush Stakeholder & Industry Interaction Meet at Vanijya Bhawan, New Delhi.
- The portal was launched by Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal and Ayush Minister Prataprao Jadhav, in the presence of Ayush Secretary Rajesh Kotecha and DPIIT Secretary Amardeep Bhatia.

What is Ayush Nivesh Saarthi?

- A digital investor facilitation platform developed by the Ministry of Ayush in partnership with Invest India.
- Offers a **unified interface** that integrates policy guidelines, incentive schemes, investment-ready projects, and real-time guidance for both domestic and international investors Objectives
- Position India as a global hub for **traditional medicine and wellness**, spanning Ayurveda, Yoga, Unani, Siddha, and Homeopathy (AYUSH).
- Attract 100 % FDI under the automatic route and promote private-sector participation in the Ayush ecosystem
